OF INSPIRING YOUNG MINDS

We are proud to be an Independent Catholic Preparatory School welcoming children of all denominations aged 3-11 years.

We are recognised as Merseyside's top independent preparatory school as highlighted by The Times Parent Power. We recognise the unique value of all our children and focus on helping them to develop their talents and potential. We are more than a place of learning. We are a place of growth, discovery and celebration. Above all we are a family – a diverse, welcoming community rooted in our core faith values. Our most recent external ISI Educational Quality inspection judged both the achievement of our pupils, including their academic development and the personal development of the pupils to be excellent the highest possible judgement. All regulatory requirements were met.

SELEBRATING OUR HERITAGE, PRESENT, ANI FUTURE

When the Notre Dame Sisters decided to close Woolton Hall Prep, it sparked an outcry among parents, staff, and pupils who believed the school was a thriving, positive environment worth preserving. In response, a group of parents, led by Michael Sampson, whose three daughters were pupils, quickly formed a committee to seek new premises and fundraise. Local businessman Tony Wilson offered to lease a large Victorian house, Carleton House on Lyndhurst Road, Mossley Hill, and parents eagerly began transforming it into a school.

The building, once home to Miss Henderson, former owner of Henderson's department store in Liverpool, required extensive renovations. With limited funds, parents took on much of the work themselves, directed by local builder Peter Robinson. Tragically, Derek Wills, another key volunteer, was killed in a car accident. Thanks to the parents' dedication, who spent evenings and weekends on renovations, the school was ready to open. After considerable debate, they chose to name it Carleton House after the inscription on the gateposts.

While some pupils transferred to other schools, the committee believed there were enough pupils to open by Easter 1975. The Notre Dame Sisters allowed the transfer of desks, furniture, books, and other essential items. Sister Theresa N.D. became the first head, with Sister Christina as secretary, and staff included Valerie Watts, Dick Aylward, Joan Tomlin, Joan Loftus, and Pauline Cullen. Mrs. Joan Tomlin, known for her discipline and effective teaching, was especially memorable, as was Mrs. Patsy Lynch, who led drama classes, preparing pupils for English Speaking Board exams and staging plays.

In September 1978, I joined the staff as a Junior Two (Year 4) teacher, while my son began in Reception. The following year, Valerie Watts relocated, and Dick Aylward took over as head. Staff responsibilities extended beyond teaching to include lunch and play supervision, as well as building maintenance, with parents contributing by tending to the grounds.

Mrs. Aylward encouraged residential trips, and with colleague Miss Celia Connor, I organized excursions to outdoor centres in Grange-over-Sands and the Lake District. The addition of nursery nurse Diane Walker was a welcome development, as she supported infant classes and actively participated in the PTA. The arrival of Hilary Kennerley, a PE specialist, enabled pupils to access gym and swimming facilities at IM Marsh, as Carleton House's facilities were limited. Following Mrs. Aylward's retirement in 1986, Phil Sweeney took over as head, broadening the curriculum and fostering connections with other schools. Carleton House began competing in local sports events, joined the Independent Schools Association, and earned recognition from the Catholic Independent Schools Council.

Although Carleton House welcomed pupils from all faiths, it maintained strong Catholic connections, initially with St. Anthony's in Mossley Hill, and later with Bishop Eton, consistently receiving positive feedback from Archdiocesan inspections.

Julie Smith joined as a full-time secretary, providing essential administrative support. After Phil Sweeney returned to St. Edward's as head, I was appointed headteacher with Lynda Williams as deputy, a role in which she excelled, particularly in directing school productions. Mrs. Jennifer Kelly, an early hire of mine, proved invaluable in teaching science and math and coaching swimming and netball teams.

As head, I prioritized a broad curriculum catering to all abilities. The addition of Mrs. Pauline O'Hanlon offered vital support for pupils needing extra help. Adopting the National Curriculum and implementing SATs allowed Carleton House to participate in league tables, boosting its reputation across Merseyside. Mrs. Fiona Mintz also became an integral part of the team, especially with her contributions to choreography for school performances.

I served as headteacher for twelve of my twenty-six years at Carleton House, continually inspired by the dedication of staff who worked collaboratively with parents to ensure pupils thrived.

Carleton House has weathered challenging times, thanks to the commitment of staff, parents, and management committees who deeply valued the unique opportunities it offered as a small school. The school has always aimed to provide a nurturing environment where children could explore a wide range of experiences and develop their talents. Its motto, "They can because they think they can," has always been at the heart of its philosophy.

It's heartening to see how Carleton House has flourished over the past fifty years.

THREE STAGES, ONE FAMILY





Carleton House School is divided into three Key Stages

Our approach and philosophy is holistic throughout the school. Our focus is childcentred, with small class sizes ensuring that we are able to give every child the attention and support they need to realise their educational and personal potential.

The school has three stages, starting with the Early Years Foundation Stage comprising:

- Nursery (age 3-4)
- Reception (age 4-5)

Our Key Stage One comprises of two classes (Year 1 and Year 2) catering for children aged five to seven. Children progress to Key Stage Two, which has four classes (Years 3-6) for the seven to eleven age range.

Small class sizes with a maximum of 23 pupils mean pupils benefit from more individual attention - especially important when preparing for entrance exams for secondary school.

NURSERY & RECEPTION (EYFS)

The beginning of their academic adventure.

Our youngest children thrive in our Nursery class. Supported and encouraged by our highly-qualified staff they quickly settle into school life and grow in confidence.

Our purposeful and engaging classrooms, excellent resources and the highest quality teaching ensure the very best start for all our children. We see Nursery as an important part of the child's familiarisation with school life and routine.

We follow the Early Year Foundation Stage Curriculum and develop a love of learning through exciting and engaging play based learning opportunities.

> Our Nursery children start with us in the September after their third birthday on a full day, term time basis.

> Our Nursery school day starts at 8.45am (with early drop off available from 8am) and finishes at 3.25pm.

After school club is available up to 6pm for nursery children which can be booked via our online booking system.

INFANTS (YEAR 1 & YEAR 2)

Key Stage 1 (Years 1 and 2) represents an important transition from the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) to a structured curriculum that balances play-based learning with more formal academics. The curriculum builds on foundational skills, focusing on core subjects like English, Mathematics, and Science to enhance reading, writing, arithmetic, and scientific curiosity through practical experiments.

Creative subjects, including Art, Music, and Design Technology, encourage self-expression, while personal and social development lessons support social skills, respect, and responsibility. Each class, with a maximum of 23 pupils, benefits from both a teacher and a full-time assistant, providing personalized support and attention.

Learning remains interactive and hands-on, using group projects and play to exploratory pupils keep School engaged. trips and extracurricular clubs further enrich learning by connecting it to real-world experiences, while sports activities promote fitness, teamwork, and sportsmanship. This comprehensive approach nurtures academic, social, and emotional development, laying a strong foundation for lifelong learning.



Key Stage 2 (Years 3–6) is a critical phase, blending academic rigor with personal development in a nurturing, community-oriented environment. The curriculum aligns with the UK National Curriculum, enhanced to prepare pupils for selective entrance and 11+ exams, equipping them for independent secondary schools.

Core subjects-English, Mathematics, and Science-focus on deepening understanding, with hands-on experiments in Science and tasks that promote critical thinking in Maths and English. Specialist teachers in subjects like Computing, PE, Spanish, and Music further enrich the educational experience, and each class benefits from a teacher and a teaching assistant for morning core lessons.

Pupils build independence and teamwork through annual residential trips, while extracurricular clubs, including Art, Music, Drama, and sports, offer creative and skill-building opportunities. The school's house system fosters community, with pupils competing and collaborating in houses named after the school's founding families. Termly assemblies, Christmas performances, and participation in competitive sports, math, and guiz events boost confidence and celebrate pupil achievements.

This well-rounded Key Stage 2 curriculum, with small classes and promotes dedicated support, both academic success and personal growth, preparing pupils for future educational endeavors in a close-knit, supportive setting.



A DISTINCTIVE EDUCATIONAL JOURNEY

Developing the whole child

Carleton House offers the full statutory primary curriculum. Pupils are prepared for Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 SATs tests. Pupils' attainment at the end of both of these Key Stages is consistently well above the expected level of attainment nationally.



With small class sizes, highly experienced class teachers, ably supported by a dedicated teaching assistant in every class, we ensure all children are supported to reach their full potential.

We employ specialist teachers of Spanish, Physical Education and Computing to ensure our children are provided with an exciting and engaging curriculum taught by specialists.

Curriculum trips and visitors

Visitors to school include Theatre Companies providing Shakespeare performances and Christmas pantomimes, Circus skills workshops for our younger children and dance work shops linked to world book day.

All trips and visits are inclusive of school fees. All classes are provided with exciting trips and visitors linked to the curriculum to enhance, support and consolidate their learning.

These range from day trips to Chester Zoo, the Liverpool Museums, Liverpool Philharmonic Concert Hall and Manchester Science Museum to name but a few.

TRIPS

children benefit from the exciting Our experience of residential trips starting in Year 3. These immersive experiences take our children out of their comfort zones and immerse them in nature, where they face challenges, develop resilience, and acquire vital life skills. During these adventures, children learn to work together, communicate effectively, and solve problems in unfamiliar settings, fostering leadership and teamwork capabilities.

Our Year 3 children spend their first one night residential with us at The Anderton Centre in Chorley. The site is spread across 4 acres of woodland and has exclusive use of Lower Rivington Reservoir. The children enjoy activities include canoeing, low ropes, abseiling and bush craft.

Our Year 4 children enjoy a two night stay at Manor Adventure in Shropshire. Culmington Manor offers exceptional facilities within a 100 acre estate in an area of outstanding natural beauty in the South Shropshire countryside. Children enjoy activities including abseiling, low ropes, fencing and crate stacking.

Our Year 5 children spend two nights away from home at Manor Adventure Willersley castle. The estate offers exceptional facilities within a 65 acre estate on the edge of the Peak District. The children take part in activities including obstacle course, blind trail, fencing and Jacob's ladder.

Each year our Year 6 pupils enter the ESB "English Speaking Board" exam. The children are carefully prepared by expert teachers to develop their public speaking skills; as they prepare to speak about a topic of personal interest, read from a favourite novel and recite a poem by heart. These skills stay with them well beyond their years with us at Carleton.

At Carleton House, all pupils are encouraged to fully develop their musical talents. Our specialist curriculum music teacher provides lessons throughout the school, from Nursery to Year 6. Children learn to sing, create and compose music, perform, and listen to and evaluate music, gaining the opportunity and confidence to become musicians.

Our strong ongoing partnership with Pulse, an outside music company, ensures that all Key Stage 2 pupils have the opportunity to learn a musical instrument through weekly lessons with experienced music teachers. Our pupils progress to grade exams and participate in Christmas and summer concerts for our families. Many go on to earn music scholarships at their chosen local secondary schools.

Pulse have been delivering education programs for over 25 years and have nine music teaching spaces, as well as an Education Centre, located in Mossley Hill, Liverpool. They also provide tuition services to some of Liverpool's leading schools.

We are members of LSSP, Liverpool Schools Sports Partnership which allows us to compete against other local schools. We also take part in school football leagues and competitions with other local independent schools.

We are lucky enough to have access to an excellent range of neighbouring facilities, including Volair pool and Wavertree athletics track. The nearby Calderstones Park is also used for cross country training and football sessions.

TRANSITION TO SECONDARY SCHOOL

At Carleton House, we are dedicated to providing a comprehensive curriculum that equips our pupils with the skills and confidence needed for their next educational phase.

Our experienced staff specialize in preparing pupils for entrance exams, focusing on timed extended writing assessments, advanced comprehension, verbal and non-verbal reasoning, quantitative reasoning, and spatial awareness. We emphasise exam technique strategies and time management throughout their learning journey.

In the Year 5 summer term, pupils engage in weekly practice tests under simulated exam conditions. During the Year 6 autumn term, we offer optional Saturday morning classes for additional preparation, along with an off-site mock exam in a local church hall at the end of September.

To support emotional well-being, we incorporate mindfulness techniques into our curriculum and hold one-on-one meetings with parents to address any concerns.

We maintain strong connections with local independent secondary schools, providing tailored exam practice and interview preparation. We also offer reference letters upon request to assist with bursary applications.
